

Deworming Recommendations

Goal: During the first year of life foals should receive a minimum of four anthelminthic treatments

- **2-3 months old:** <u>Deworming recommendation</u>: Fenbendazole: 0.1 ml/kg=4.5 ml/100 lb (Double Dose -10 mg/kg)
- 4-6 months old: (just before weaning): <u>Deworming recommendation:</u> Fenbendazole: 0.1 ml/kg=4.5 ml/100 lb (Double Dose)10 mg/kg) <u>OR</u> Pyrantel pamoate: 6 ml/45 kg=6 ml/100 lb (6.67 mg/kg)
- 7-9 months old: Check fecal egg count to determine the type of worms most prevalent. <u>Deworming recommendation</u>: Ivermectin + Praziquantel <u>OR</u> Pyrantel Pamoate:12 ml/45 kg= 12 ml/100 lb (13.3 mg/kg)
- **12 months old**: Check fecal egg count to determine the type of worms most prevalent (if not done previously). <u>Deworming recommendation</u>: Ivermectin
- Yearlings and 2 year olds: Deworm 3-4 times per year. Focus on deworming during grazing season: April-November.
 Deworming recommendation: Ivermectin. In late fall, deworm with Ivermectin + Praziguantel
- 3 year olds and adults
 - Check fecal egg count to determine if your horse is a low, medium, or high shedder
 - The number of times to deworm each horse in a year is based on how many worms they have. This can range from 1-4 times per year.
 - Deworming recommendations: Ivermectin or Moxidectin, Adding on Praziquantel in late fall. Ideally using either moxidectin or fenbendazole 10 mg/kg once yearly to target encysted strongyles.
